Notice of Race

1. Rules

- 1.1 Racing will be governed by the 'Rules' defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the National Class Associations rules, and the Sailing Instructions;
- 1.2 The Racing Rules of Sailing 32, A2, A3 and Race Signal AP will be changed, see the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.3 This Notice of Race may be amended by a Notice to competitors from the Organising Authority. If there is any conflict with a Sailing Instruction, the Sailing Instruction shall prevail.

2. Eligibility

2.1 Racing will be open to any Osprey dinghy conforming to the Osprey Class Rules

3. Entries and fees

- Entries shall be submitted on the official entry form for this event available from the Club on the day along with the entry fee of £25. Cheques made payable to **Tata Steel Sailing Club, Margam**.
- There will be a reduction to £15 when helm are juniors.

4. Schedule

- 4.1 Registration Competitors shall register at the Clubhouse on from 10.00 a.m. on the first day
- 4.2 Briefing A competitors' briefing will be held at the Race Control Office at 12.00
- 4.3 Race schedule five races are scheduled:

Race 1 Saturday 13.00.pm Races 2 &3 to be announced Race 4 Sunday Starts 11.00.am Race 5 to be announced

3.4 No Warning signal will be made after 3.00pm on the last day of sailing

5. Measurement

Each boat must have a valid measurement certificate and buoyancy endorsement, and must sail under the original sail number unless otherwise authorized by the race officer.

6. Sailing Instructions and Notices to competitors

- 6.1 Sailing instructions will be issued at registration.
- 6.2 Notices to competitors will be posted at the Race Control Office.

7. Course and Racing Area

7.1 The racing area and course will be announced at the briefing and described on the course board.

8. Scoring

- 8.1 The event will be scored using RRS Appendix A, except that each boat's series score will be the total of her race scores with her worst score excluded if 4 or more races have been completed.
- 8.2 Two scored races are required for the results to be counted.

9. Prizes

9.1 Prizes will be given as follows: First. Second and Third Place

10. Support boats

10.1 Only patrol boats appointed by the race officer may enter the race area or communicate with competitors afloat

11. Risk Statement and Disclaimer of Liability

- The responsibility for a boat's decision to race is hers alone (*RRS* Rule 4). By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved and accept responsibility for themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk;
 - b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and property, whether afloat or ashore:
 - c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - d) Their boat, including helm and crew, is fit for the conditions and that they are competent to sail and compete in them;
 - e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers does not relieve them of their own responsibilities:
 - f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 11.2 Each sailor under the age of 18 at the time of registration will be required to submit a consent form signed by a parent or guardian confirming acceptance of the terms above. The parent or guardian or a nominated alternate will be asked to be in or around the club while their dependent is racing.

12. Insurance

Boats are required to be adequately insured including insurance against third party claims of at least £2,000,000.

13. Safety

Competitors will be required to wear adequate personal buoyancy at all times whilst afloat – except for a short period whilst changing clothing. Flag 'Y' will not be displayed; this changes RRS rules 40.1 and Race Signals 'Y'. Wet suits and dry suits do not comply with this

14. Rights to use names and likenesses

14.1 Competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.
