

Following the First Minister's announcement on Friday, 14th January, we will be making the following changes.

For Sunday 16th January, if you are coming to the club please book in via the online booking system. The maximum we are allowed to have at the club is increased from 50 to 500, but in absence of any other changes to the government rules, we are still unable to have spectators. You should only come if you're going on the water, are a parent or guardian to a junior, are doing boat maintenance, or are part of the duty team.

For Sunday 23rd January, the online booking system is withdrawn and you should sign on in the club lobby whether you are going afloat or not. There are separate sheets for going afloat or not. You may come to the club even if you're not sailing.

During this time, we are limited to 30 people in the clubhouse but this is a theoretical maximum as we should be maintaining social distance at all times and wearing masks other than when seated. We will still be running the band system for the changing rooms. The move to alert level zero for internal events on Friday 28th will not really affect us as we are limited by the size of the building.

We are also allowing boat maintenance outside of the sailing sessions. If you do come to the club at times when it is not normally open you must sign the visitors' book in the lobby so we have a track and trace record.

I will send out another bulletin soon to advise of our reopening for Saturday casual sailing, windsurfing etc.

Keep safe and see you on the water.
